More than 76 years after its creation, the AFA updates its name to the Air & Space Forces Association, a force truly representative of what the AFA upholds and supports. Born in 1946, over a year before the creation of the Air Force, the AFA has always stood behind the Air Force and promoted Airpower. Now, 76 years later history repeats itself; the AFA stands behind our newly-formed Space Force and champions the defense and protection of the space domain. The AFA's acronym stays the same but the new name and symbol redefine what those letters stand for. The updated star-delta logo preserves our heritage and embraces our Space Force. The "star" is derived from the original Hap Arnold Army Air Corps logo and the "delta" and "polaris" are derived from the Space Force's logo.


Memorial Day Remembering who we lost

Memorial Day means many things to different people around the world. For some, it is a chance to spend a little time with the family. For others, it may be a chance to celebrate the coming of summer and the end of the school season. However, for anyone who has ever served or has known someone who has served, Memorial Day takes on a somber meaning. "We all gave some, but some gave all". Unlike Veteran's Day, Memorial Day honors servicemembers who died while serving the United States.

Memorial Day is observed on the last Monday of May; it was initially known as Decoration Day before it became an official holiday in 1971. Three years after the Civil War ended an organization comprised of Union veterans established Decoration Day to decorate the graves of soldiers who died during the war. It was originally observed on May 30 which was thought to be a time when all of the flowers across the U.S. would be in bloom.

General Ulysses S. Grant presided over the first large observance of Decoration Day. The orphaned children of servicemembers killed during the Civil War decorated the graves of both Union and Confederate servicemembers.

Many organizations hold springtime tributes for the fallen through ceremonies, parades, and of course going back to its roots, laying flowers beside the graves of fallen soldiers.

Space Force to Add Three Intelligence Squadrons

The Space Force plans to add three new intelligence squadrons in the next two years, said Lt. Gen. Stephen N. Whiting, commander of the service's Space Operations Command. The additions would double the number of squadrons in Space Delta 7, whose intel Guardians already work on missile warning and defense, electronic warfare, and research and development. The new squadrons will include a threat analysis squadron, a targeting squadron, and a PED squadron, short for processing, exploitation, and dissemination.

US Troops Return to Somalia as Al-Shabab Threat Increases ABRAHAM MAHSHIE

President Joe Biden approved a Defense Department request to return "under 500" American forces to Somalia, where the al-Shabab terrorist group has grown in wealth and influence and increased the tempo of its attacks since American troops pulled out in January 2021. A senior administration official told members of the press May 16 that al-Shabab posed a danger to the American homeland and to U.S. interests in East Africa. Al-Shabab has killed a dozen Americans in East Africa, including three in a January 2020 cross-border attack on a U.S. position in Manda Bay, Kenya. In his April 14, 2021 speech announcing the U.S. withdraw from Afghanistan, President Biden said the U.S. would target growing terrorist affiliates expanding safe havens in places such as Africa.

Mitchell Institute's New UAV Study Center Looks at Drones in a China Fight

Unmanned aerial vehicles and autonomous aircraft may provide a solution to operating in heavily contested domains such as the Taiwan Straits, according to a panel of expert who suggested operationalizing artificial intelligence for such purposes sooner rather than later. The group gathered virtually May 12 to help launch the Mitchell Institute for Aerospace Studies' new Center for UAV and Autonomy Studies (MI-UAS). The Mitchell Institute is part of AFA. "China, in particular, has developed networks of very long-range missiles, electronic warfare systems, and other power projection capabilities that could severely limit or even prevent the ability of the U.S. to defend its interests in the Indo-Pacific," said Caitlin Lee, Mitchell Institute senior fellow for UAV and Autonomy Studies and head of the new center. "UAVs may have an important role to play in this fight," Lee added.

Colorado Introduces New Suicide Prevention Program for Military Veterans KYLE COOKE

Operation Veteran Strong is a suicide prevention program recently launched. It is free and confidential—available 24/7— and allows veterans to connect with national and local resources designed to prevent mental health crises. Veterans make up about 10% of Colorado's population, yet 17% of all suicides in Colorado are veterans, according to CDPHE. Moreover, "the suicide rate among veterans is more than double the rate of non-veterans," said Sarah Brummett, director of the Office of the Suicide Prevention at CDPHE, in a news release. The agencies behind Operation Veteran Strong hope they can be part of the solution. Operation Veteran Strong is the result of Colorado's participation in the Governor's Challenge to Prevent Suicide Among Service Members, Veterans, and their Families, which was convened in 2018.
